For many of our young Path To Shine students, their daily experiences involve very grown-up worries like poverty, hunger, and uncertainty. Through dedicated mentors and thoughtful programming, Path To Shine helps under-served children build the skills, self-confidence, and resiliency needed to chase – and achieve – their hope-filled dreams.

This past spring, we gathered with Path To Shine students, parents, siblings, friends, and mentors to celebrate the milestone of another successful year, and I was reminded of a saying often attributed to poet William Butler Yeats.

“Education is not the filling of a pail but the lighting of a fire.” Lighting that fire is precisely our aim.

Since launching our first program in 2010, Path To Shine has trained more than 300 volunteer mentors and provided over 26,000 hours of caring, adult mentorship. The positive impacts of our mentors' service are reflected in the actions of the children themselves—many of whom join Path To Shine as kindergartners, remain committed and involved throughout their elementary years, and graduate from the program in fifth grade as self-confident, capable young leaders.

We've read hundreds of books, tackled countless pages of math, and shared thousands of healthy after-school snacks. We've giggled, played games, told stories, and witnessed the immense inner pride that shines from within when a child's lightbulb flickers on and a new understanding is achieved.

In the spirit of togetherness, we cheer on graduates as they transition from elementary to middle school, ready and prepared for their next step. We recognize the contributions of amazing volunteer mentors, many of whom have faithfully served for three, five, even seven years! And we offer prayers of thanksgiving for the friends and community that continue to faithfully lift up Path To Shine's mission.
